


Internet Service Providers (ISPs) typically have a number of different plans, each promising a different tier of speed.



But when it comes to internet speed, what you experience isn't always what the ISP is delivering.


## The Complexity of Internet Speed


## Why speeds differ beyond the Gateway






only a portion of the available

## Speed Matters: Making the Most of Your Internet Connection

If your Speedtest results are significantly lower than the speeds you pay for, try placing your router in a central location away from any sources of interference, while also making sure your equipment can handle your plan's speeds.
